



By the Numbers

- 1885:** The year JHS was founded; we are the second oldest nonprofit in Jacksonville.
- 1920:** The year JHS opened the Beach Boulevard shelter.
- 2005:** The year JHS became a No-Kill shelter, shifting focus to implement model programs and forge strategic partnerships to achieve a No-Kill community.
- 2,400+** The number of underage kittens who received a second chance at life through our Kitten University and Foster Program
- 6,000+:** The number of dogs and cats who are spayed and neutered at the JHS hospital each year.
- 5,400:** The number of orphaned dogs and cats JHS shelters and finds loving homes for each year.
- 3,000:** The number of animals JHS transferred in from Jacksonville's government shelter; many require intensive medical and behavioral care.
- 3,500+:** The number of families experiencing problems with their pets that receive help such as free behavior assistance, pet food and veterinary care from JHS annually with the goal of keeping pets with their families and out of shelters.
- 5,000:** The number of children and young adults JHS delivers humane education to each year. JHS also partners with other nonprofit agencies to incorporate animals in lessons targeting at-risk youth.
- \$5 million:** The annual cost of JHS's lifesaving work.
- September 2014:** Announcement is made that Jacksonville has maintained No-kill status for a full fiscal year. The City of Jacksonville has remained a no kill city ever since.
